Lessons from Auschwitz Project

This four-part course explores the universal lessons of the Holocaust and its relevance for today. The LFA Project aims to increase knowledge and understanding of the Holocaust for young people and to clearly highlight what can happen if prejudice and racism become acceptable. The course consists of the following elements:

Wednesday 1 November: Orientation Seminar (3:00pm – 7:00pm)
 Tuesday 7 November: trip to Auschwitz (Poland)
 Sunday 12 November: seminar (1:00pm – 4:30pm)
 Wednesday 7 February: 'Next Steps' submission

After completing the 'Next Steps' submission, students become Holocaust Educational Trust Ambassadors.
