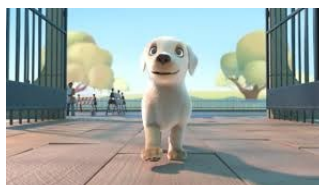

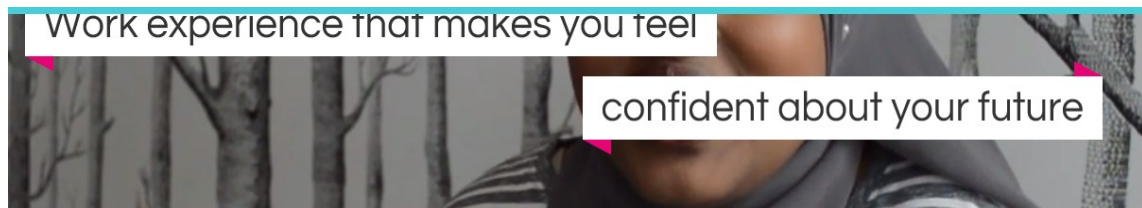
Struggling To Find Work Experience?

FEBRUARY FOCUS - LITTER - BIN IT!

- 🗑️ Cleaning up litter from the streets of Britain costs around £500 million each year
- 🗑️ 7 out of every 10 items of dropped litter is food packaging or wrappers
- 🗑️ 48% of people admit to dropping litter
- 🗑️ 1.3m individual pieces of litter are dropped on UK roads every weekend

WHAT DO WE DO?

- 🗑️ Our teams are encouraged to pick up litter around the refectory and seating areas and place it in the correct bins
- 🗑️ We ensure all litter from our kitchens are placed in the correct recycling bins
- 🗑️ Work with our suppliers to reduce the amount of packaging that goods are sent into every kitchen

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- 🗑️ Do not drop your litter or gum in the first place
- 🗑️ Place litter in the bins provided
- 🗑️ Take just 2 minutes every day to pick up litter – corridors, playing fields or even classrooms
